

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

between

**CENTRE FOR AMERICAN EDUCATION (CAE)
BROWARD COMMUNITY COLLEGE (Singapore)**

and

UNIVERSITY OF WINDSOR

APPROVED TRANSFERRED CREDITS

Proposal:

The Articulation Committee proposes that the University of Windsor and the Centre for American Education, Broward Community College (Singapore), enter into an articulation agreement with respect to the CAE two-year Associate Degree program for which transferring students have appropriate prerequisites. This agreement will be the first such agreement between the University of CAE.

Background:

The two-year program at CAE provides general education core courses, similar to those offered in American junior colleges. CAE is partnered with Broward Community College in Florida. This program has been examined by the University of Windsor's Articulations Committee and found to provide adequate preparation for advanced study at the University of Windsor. Specifically, the recommendation is that any student completing a minimum of 60 credit hours from BCC, be considered for admission with up to 20 semester courses of advanced standing at the University of Windsor. In order to facilitate these students' entry to the University, courses in the two-year program at CAE have been examined by the appropriate University of Windsor programs, and equivalencies have been established (see Appendix 1). These equivalencies will form the basis of admission and transfer credits for CAE students who apply to the University of Windsor.

Details:

Students who have completed a minimum of 60 credits in either the Arts or Science streams of the CAE program with a cumulative average grade of B and who are otherwise admissible to the University of Windsor, including meeting the University of Windsor's English competency requirements, will receive University of Windsor credits, up to a total of twenty semester courses for courses taken from the appended list, provided they passed the respective college courses with a grade of C- or better. Students will not be restricted to enrolling in a specific program but must present the necessary prerequisites for entry into the program of their choice. The course credits received will be applicable to any Bachelor's program providing the degree

requirements of that program allow it. Students will have to meet all regular requirements for the major of their choice prior to graduation.
